Chocolate Peanut Butter Hummus

Ingredients

- 1 (15-oz.) can chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- 1/3 c. honey
- 1/4 c. plus 2 tbsp. creamy peanut butter
- 1/4 c. unsweetened dutch process or dark chocolate cocoa powder
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- Pinch of salt
- Mini chocolate chips, for topping
- Flaky sea salt, for topping

Directions

1. **Step 1-** Place the chickpeas, honey, 1/4 cup peanut butter, cocoa powder, vanilla, and salt in the bowl of a food processor. Blend until smooth.
2. **Step 2-** Transfer to a serving bowl. Melt remaining 2 tablespoons peanut butter in the microwave and drizzle over dip. Top with mini chips and flaky sea salt.
3. Serve with pretzels, strawberries, apples, etc.

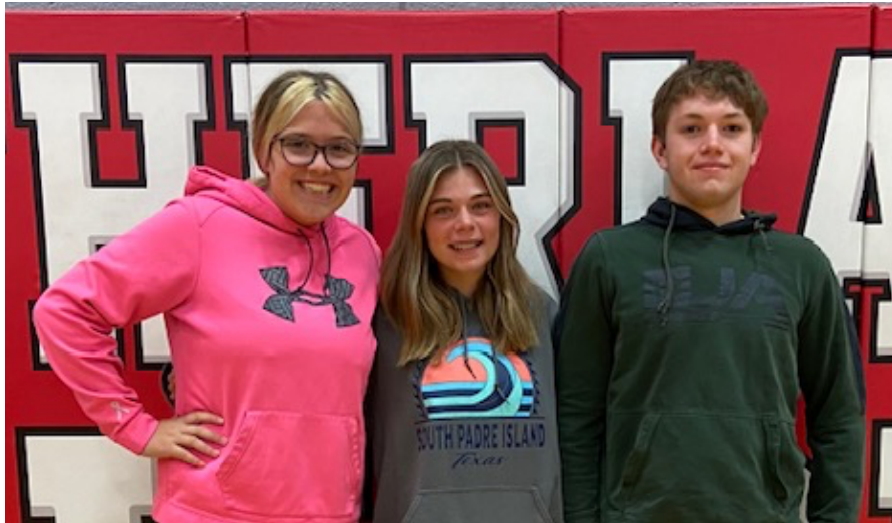

Medication Reminders from the Handbook:

Medications Policy 5024

Prescription medication:

- 1-Parents/guardians must provide a physician's written authorization for the administration of the medication.
- 2-Parents/guardians must provide their own written permission for the administration of the medication.
- 3-The medication must be brought to school **(by an adult)** in the prescription container & must be properly labeled with the student's name, and directions for administering the medication.

Non-prescription medication:

- 1-Parents/guardians must provide written permission for the administration of the medication.
- 2- The medication must be brought to the school **(by an adult)** in the manufacturer's container.
- 3-The container must be labeled with the child's name and with directions for provision or administration of the medication.


