#### **Parent/Teacher Conferences**



Parent/teacher conferences are a great opportunity for families to sit down one-on-one with their child's teacher and talk about their child's progress in school. For many families, this may be their first opportunity to visit with their child's teacher and talk about how things are going at school. This process of sitting down with your child's teacher is the foundation for establishing an honest and productive relationship with your student's teacher. This relationship will help increase the likelihood of academic success for your child. As a parent it's important to use this time to share your impressions of the school year, and to ask any questions you might have. If you run out of time at the conference and are on your way home and thought why didn't I ask this question? Just drop your child's teacher a written note, or schedule a second face-to-face meeting. And remember strong parent involvement and a partnership with your child's teacher will send a positive message to your student. When this partnership is in place, success follows.

Please make every effort you can to attend the parent/teacher conferences, September 28<sup>th</sup> & October 1<sup>st</sup>. If these dates don't fit your schedule, contact the school and set a time that you as a parent can collaborate with your child's teachers. As a reminder, the conference doesn't have to be a one-time event as it's our desire to have a partnership of regular and meaningful communication throughout the school year.

#### **SPS Foundation**

The Sutherland Public Schools Foundation annual fund drive begins October 1<sup>st</sup>. The goal of the challenge is to raise \$10,000 dollars by the end of the year, December 31<sup>st</sup>. The mission of the foundation is to *Enrich* our school, *Equip* our teachers, and *Expand* opportunities for our children. The foundation is a non-profit organization that allows donors to give tax-deductible donations. These donations help fund projects, large and small, benefiting our students and teachers.



Donors may give an undesignated gift, or a donor may select a specific project to fund. The principal amount of undesignated gifts is never spent, thus your donation will always be giving. A donor's recognition board has been placed at the school honoring donors. Contributors on the board range from \$250 - \$10,000. There have been challenges made to the SPS Foundation by graduating classes which include the following classes: 1945, 1955, 1957, 1961, 1963, & 1965.

**2021-2022 School District Budget**

The valuation of property for the 2021-2022 school year was \$422,752,305, last year's valuation was \$408,954,905. This equates to an increase in valuation of \$13,797,400. The budget for the 2021-2022 school year was set at the September school board meeting. The total levy will decrease slightly again this year while the tax asking increased \$138,000.

State Aid also known as TEOSA (Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act) would likely apply to Sutherland if Ag valuations decrease. If this were to happen it would increase the probability of receiving equalization aid (state aid). Currently our district is non-equalized thus no funds are received from TEOSA (the state aid formula). Equalization aid to our district has gone from a high of \$1.6m in 2008 to \$44,000 today.

I would like to recognize the school board for their fiscal responsibility in budgeting for the district. School budgets are very unique and require somewhat of a balancing act. Schools need to balance the needs of the students, staff, facilities, transportation etc. all the while keeping the district's taxpayers in mind.

**APPLE CRISP**

- 4-6 large Granny Smith apples
  - 8 graham crackers, chopped
  - ¾ cup (175 mL) packed brown sugar
  - ½ cup (125 mL) quick or old-fashioned oats
  - ½ cup (125 mL) all-purpose flour
  - 1½ tsp (7 mL) ground cinnamon
  - ⅓ cup (75 mL) butter, melted
  - Whipped cream or ice cream (optional)
1. Peel, core, and slice the apples, then place them in a small microwave-safe pan.
  2. Combine graham crackers, brown sugar, oats, flour, and cinnamon. Add butter; mix well. Spoon over apples.
  3. Microwave on HIGH 12-15 minutes or until apples are tender.
  4. Cool slightly. Serve with whipped cream or ice cream, if you like.

Sutherland Families,

I know we are all surprised how fast September has flown by! We have certainly had a fantastic month here - it's been incredibly busy, but the progress students have made in just a few short weeks has been astounding! By now, everyone is settling in well to their classrooms, their new routines, and getting down to the business of learning. This year has so much in store and I am excited to witness the growth of your students.

Now that October is approaching, we have noticed an ever so slight dip in our temperatures. With that being said, please ensure your students are not only abiding by the current dress code policies, but also dressing appropriately to adapt to the changes in weather.

October is going to be a fast and furious month for us on campus. Currently, we have the following events planned:

- September 28 - Parent/Teacher Conferences (North Gym from 3:30-8:00)
- October 1st - Parent/Teacher Conferences (In Classrooms from 8:00-12:00)
- October 1st - We will host a COVID Vaccine Clinic (Pfizer) on Campus that will be open to the public. Please contact us if you have any questions.
- October 4-8 - Homecoming Week (full of activities)
- October 15 - End of 1st Quarter



As the end of our first quarter of school draws near, please take the time to log into PowerSchool to check your student's grades. The website can be located at <https://sailors.powerschool.com/public/home.html>. If you have any difficulty utilizing PowerSchool please contact the high school office.

By now, you should have received emails from your students updating you on their progress in their classes. These emails should discuss behaviors and grades. If you have not received these emails, please let the Seminar teacher or the high school office know because this is a regular practice we are requiring students to partake in every Tuesday.

In regard to the Parent/Teacher Conferences, we are asking that parents log into PowerSchool from their phone or home computer to check their students' schedules and grades. Conferences are a great time to talk to teachers about how students are doing in each class and to talk about any concerns students may be having. We also recommend that students attend the conference and work on self advocacy skills, as well as build communication skills that will keep teachers, students, and parents on the same page.

Additionally, we recently began diving into student data as a means to better understand their academic successes and growth. We also discussed this data (focus on MAP scores) with students and encouraged them to set growth goals so students better understand the importance of accountability and steady effort towards growth.

Furthermore, COVID protocols have been fluctuating during the short time we have been in session due to the ever changing reality of this health crisis. However, we have maintained the following guidelines and will continue to do so:

- If your student is experiencing COVID-like symptoms, your student will be asked to wear a mask and visit with the nurse.
- If your student possesses a fever, your student will be required to wear a mask and go home or stay home from school.
- If your student has tested positive for COVID, your student will not be allowed to attend school until your student receives a negative test result, or surpasses the 14 day guideline established.
- If your student does not have symptoms, but has tested positive for COVID, your student will be required to quarantine for 14 days from the test date and will also need a release note to return to school.

- We are encouraging masks, but they are not required.
- Additionally, if students have a new cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or a loss of taste/smell, they will also have to go through their health provider or West Central Health District to return to school.
- If your student has had direct contact with an individual who has tested positive for COVID, please notify the school so we can be proactive and do our best to guide them in the steps they need to take at that time.

The bottom line is, we want students in school and completing in-person learning, so we are doing all we can to keep them healthy!

Finally, I would like to thank parents, students, and the community for a productive opening to our school year. School activities are in full swing, along with the many clubs and activities offered to students. Students continue to be involved in a multitude of activities, including Football, Cross Country, Volleyball, FFA, Drama, Music, and other groups. I would encourage parents and students to utilize our school calendar located on our school website at [www.spssailors.org](http://www.spssailors.org), and by accessing the Sutherland app to stay aware of weekly events. We will also post it on our school app and social media!

I am extremely proud of our staff and students as we sail through the 2021-2022 school year. Many of our students have adjusted to the length of the school day as well as the rules and routines that are in place to keep our school safe and our classrooms to be productive areas for learning. Students are working hard to learn new concepts and skills at their grade level. We appreciate all you are doing from home to help your child to do his/her best at school. Continue to make sure your child has a healthy start to the day with breakfast (currently FREE for all students at school), gets enough quality sleep, and also participates in some exercise throughout the day. ### BRIDGES MATH

Throughout a lesson, students are involved in whole group instruction, small group instruction, and independent practice. ### PBIS (BE SAFE, BE RESPONSIBLE, BE RESPECTFUL & ALWAYS DO YOUR BEST!)



Sutherland Public School is in year #6 of implementing PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports) across all PreK-12 classrooms to enhance the climate and learning environment for all students. A district-wide leadership team comprised of 10 teachers, parents and administrators meet on a monthly basis and attend training during the summer and school year. Our Sailor "BRAND" (THE SAILOR WAY) is "Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible & Always Do Your Best!" New posters are displayed and visible throughout the school. Teachers have revisited their own classroom expectations to align with The Sailor Way as well. These expectations have been taught and modeled to their individual classes. To assist in creating a positive and supportive classroom atmosphere, teachers have spent a lot of time in

August/September teaching and modeling classroom expectations. If you have any input for the leadership team, you are welcome to send it to Mrs. Floyd, Mrs. Huebner, or Mrs. Staggs.

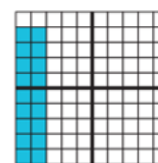

### **SAILOR PRIDE COINS**

Elementary students have been working collectively with their classmates to earn Sailor PRIDE coins. Each grade level has a goal of attaining 25 coins. Students have the opportunity to earn a coin by demonstrating positive choices/behaviors. All staff members (paras, custodians, teachers, kitchen staff, admin) have coins and are encouraged to reinforce students for positive behaviors they observe during the day. Students are aware that they won't receive a coin for every positive action they display, but they should feel good inside for making a good choice/decision. All classes have now earned 25 coins and have had the opportunity to spin the SAILOR WHEEL to receive a small incentive (S'MORE Good Behavior, Popcorn Party, recess at Anchor Memorial Park) to name just a few. I encourage our students to keep making awesome choices and showing your Sailor PRIDE! Our elementary has a goal of earning 750 Pride Coins during the year and they are well on their way. Collectively, they have earned 225 PRIDE COINS at this time.

### **BOYS TOWN SOCIAL SKILLS**

Teachers have been spending a great deal of time in the first weeks of school on a few of the key Boys Town Social Skills. Students have learned about HOW TO GREET, FORMAL LINES, HOW TO MAKE A REQUEST, HOW TO GET SOMEONE'S ATTENTION, HOW TO FOLLOW DIRECTIONS, and HOW TO LISTEN. I encourage you to practice and follow the steps to these skills at home. Practicing and reinforcing these skills helps us at Sutherland Elementary to have a positive and safe learning environment for everyone! Boys Town Social Skills are effective in any setting, home or school! Be sure to specifically PRAISE your child for following these skills. If you are on social media, share something positive about your kids or tell another parent what an incredible job they are doing. Tag them in the post and ask them to #PraiselOn too! Together we can transform the social conversation into one that is positive and helpful.

### Note from the Nurse:

A reminder to parents of children **entering pre-K , Kindergarten, 7th grades and out of state transfer students**, be sure to complete their child's immunizations, as well a physical and eye exams. These are state laws we have to comply with. The school is responsible in reporting these to the state. We are on a time line in sending this report, so please get this completed by October 15th if you have not yet completed these requirements.

Our Health Screening was held September 24, with the help of the Lions Club. We are very grateful to have their assistance with the vision and hearing screening. Results of this will be sent home soon.

Health Care Plans are currently under review. Many may have received forms to be completed and returned to the school. These follow state law Rule 59. Please contact us if you have questions or wish to review this with the school nurse.

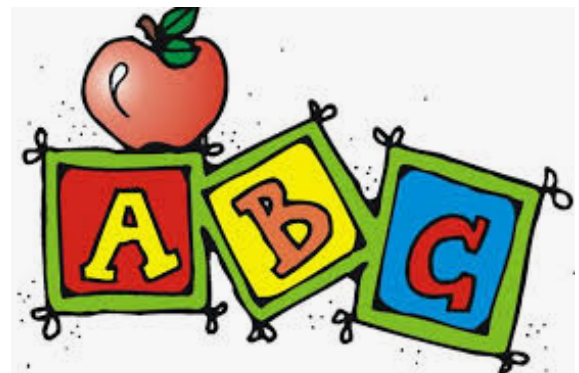

## CHILD FIND SCREENINGS NEWS RELEASE

Local school districts in cooperation with ESU 16 are sponsoring an opportunity for parents of preschool children to participate in Child Find Screenings. This fall screening will be made available in each school district at the request of parents.

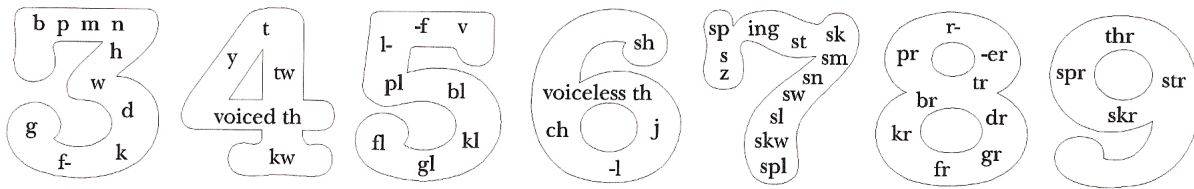
Child Find is a screening program for preschool children between the ages of birth and five. Professionals will be available to answer questions from parents regarding their preschool child's speech and language development, motor development, social/emotional development, hearing and learning skills. Parents who suspect that their child (age 0-5) may need special help in these areas are encouraged to call their school district. The local school district will arrange for evaluation in cooperation with ESU 16. Evaluation will be done at a time and place convenient for the family.

Children between the ages of five and twenty-one who reside in Arthur, Grant, Hooker, Keith, Lincoln, Logan, McPherson, Perkins and Thomas counties may be referred to the school's Student Assistance Team. The Student Assistance Team provides suggestions for accommodation/modification. This referral may result in an evaluation for special help. Parents should contact their local school district to request this referral.

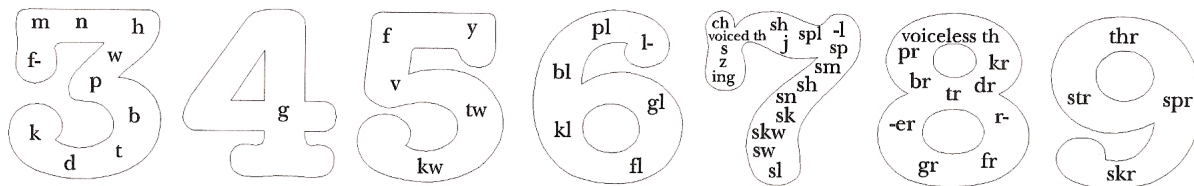
# SOUND CHART

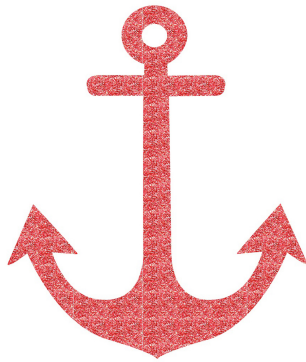
